Ground Zero for live music in Adelaide, 'The Gov' hosts some legendary local and international acts. The odd Irish band fiddles around in the bar, while the main venue features rock, folk, jazz, blues, salsa, reggae and dance. A huge place with an inexplicably personal vibe. Good food, too.

Top 5 places to test your fitness.

1. Mt Lofty Walking trail – Waterfall Gully

3.9km of pleasure and pain. Beautiful surroundings and step climbing. It's a sharp climb at the beginning, then there's soft levelled relief then the final sharp climb tests your fitness and mind power. Average time to climb is 50-60minutes. For fast fit walkers 40-45minutes. And the super athletes that jog it 25-30mins. Myself about half a day.

Keep your eyes on the trees and if you're lucky, you might see some koalas snoozing in the trees during the heat of the day.



2. The Snake Pit – Larges Bay

For a whole world of pain, take on the snake pit. This is a 4.8 km run in Larges Bay. The Run has a total ascent of 4.85 m maxing an elevation of 13.12 m. If you survive its bite you can take on anything.




3. Hallett Cove Steps – Hallett Cove shoreline

The Marion Coastal Walking Trail is in the Marion Coast Park which extends 7.2 km from Marino in the north, to the Hallett Headland Reserve at Hallett Cove in the south. The trail is full of steps, steps and more steps.

4. Mine Track – Blackhill Conservation Park

This is a much longer walk taking 3hrs but less intense than the others. The view is amazing and is worth it.



5. Three Waterfalls Walking Trail

Just 12km north east of Adelaide, the Three Falls Hike in Morialta Falls Conservation Park has all these things and more. It's an ideal hike for those who enjoy climbing, scrambling over rocks, crossing creeks and maybe getting a little muddy. The 7.3km hike, commences from the First Falls car park, located at the end of Morialta Falls Road, off Stradbroke Road.

First Falls is a seasonal waterfall
